A modern campus located in south-east Bavaria in verdant surroundings, a few minutes' walk from Passau's historic Old Town.

Passau is widely considered to be one of the loveliest towns in Germany and is ideally situated between the European metropolises of Prague, Munich and Vienna.

The University of Passau owes its strong visibility and renown to excellent research, innovative education and its tight-knit global academic networks.

The University's academic profile is shaped by its five faculties and the overarching research themes spanning state, society, business and economy, the legal system, languages and cultural regions, media and communication, the education system, and computer science and mathematics.

Our research is strongly aligned with the overarching themes of Europe, Sustainability and Digitalisation, which underscore the interdisciplinary identity of our University and the long tradition of inter-faculty collaboration.



Doctoral degrees are awarded by all five faculties.

All doctoral projects are research projects.

Doctoral research can be conducted:

- as an individually supervised project
- working as a graduate research assistant
- in a structured, international doctoral programme

The Graduate Centre is a cross-faculty umbrella organisation for all doctoral and postdoctoral researchers.

It provides information and seminars on:

- research methods
- principles of good academic research
- teaching in a higher education setting
- management of academic organisations
- academic and non-academic careers

The Graduate Centre also administers grants for travel expenses and thesis publications.

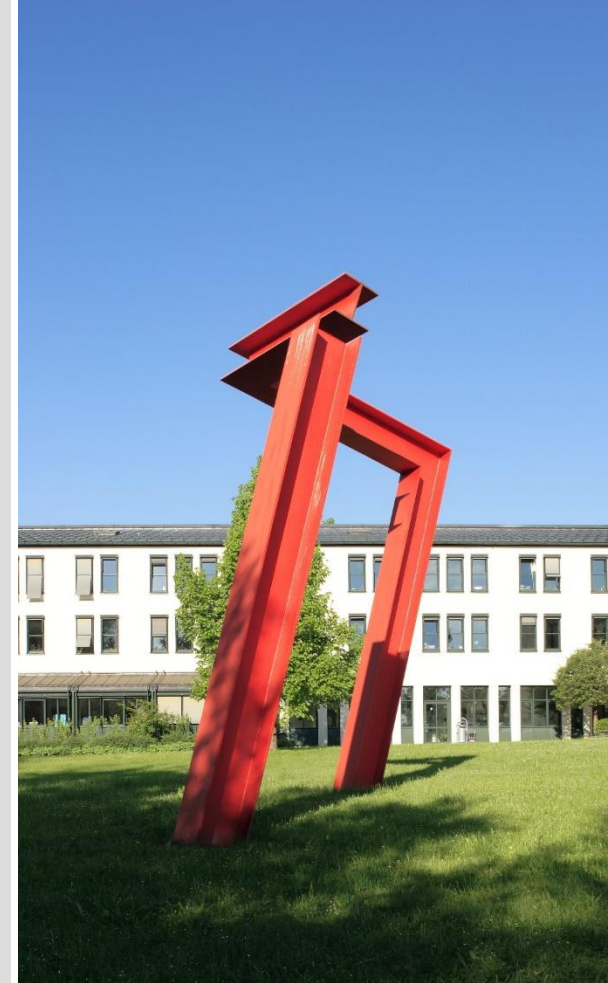

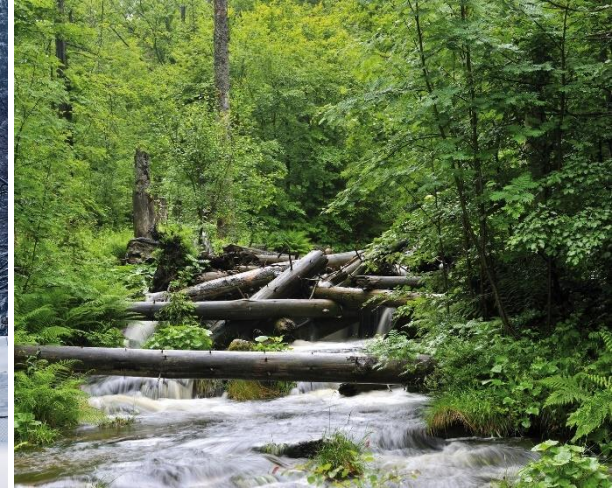
